2020 brought more than just a pandemic, it was a record breaking Atlantic Hurricane season. Early on August 27th, Hurricane Laura made landfall in the state of Louisiana as a Category 4 hurricane with maximum winds of 150 mph only 7 mph short of being a Category 5. Reports warned of unsurvivable storm surge in both Texas and Louisiana. It was 11 hours after making landfall before Laura became a tropical storm. The Louisiana Governor announced Laura as the most powerful Hurricane in their history surpassing Hurricane Katrina that struck in 2005. Power outages, downed trees and property destruction were everywhere. To the left, Dad Nick captures the fascination of Nicholas, Ellie and Essie with a butterfly they encountered along the High Bridge Trail.




Looking to the Future
